Story of Hazrat Shoaib^{AS} **(Strange Graves) English Translation**

Spread to all 4 sides were the strange graves, which in reality were the houses where once lived the nation of Madiyan. Dishonesty and Falsity brought ruins to this nation. This nation suffered a punishment of God, due to ignoring the divine heed. Apparently they were simple clouds but they wrote the story of God's wrath for this nation.

An incident with a moral lesson for today's world

It was a vast area covered with dense and tall jungle, containing different kind of trees with fruits. These fruits were source of nourishment for animals and humans alike. Many different kinds of animals including deer, wild camels and moose were quite common in this part of the world. Nation of Madiyan was settled around this jungle covering a large area in Arab. Capital city of this nation was known as Madiyan. Sheppards of Madiyan would go in and out of jungle quite often with their herds, which became the reason for this nation to be called in Quran as 'Ashab-ul-Aika' or people of Jungle.

This area was quite important because of its location in trade. Madiyan was on a crossroad of two very important and big routes between Yemen, Syria, Egypt and Persian sea. Geographically, it was a very important location for this nation since the economy of the region was dependent on their trading. God showered a lot of His bounties on the nation of Madiyan, but instead of being grateful, they became greedy and gradually started increasing their dishonesty in their matters and falsity in their trades. Giving less and charging more and deceiving the customer became a common trait of their trade.

Caravans going from Yeman to Syria were very agitated due to paying heavy taxes to Madiyan. In addition, the area of Madiyan was littered with bandits and thugs. Caravans were robbed quite often and tradesmen were killed. People of Madiyan did not pay attention to the complaints that were made and the mischief continued.

The cruelties of this nation continued to increase. Their dishonesty, theft and moral vices escalated. This was the time when Allah Almighty had mercy on them and raised a prophet among them. Do you know who this prophet was? Let us tell you that in order to give guidance to the people of Madiyan, Allah Almighty selected one pious person from this nation whose name was Hazrat Shoaib (as).

Hazrat Shoaib (as) used to look at the situation of their nation with pain, he was aware of how far they have come in ways of dishonesty, Fraudulent behavior had become their second nature. Hazrat Shoaib^{AS} knew that apparently, coming back to honest life was impossible, but

possessed zeal and passion to guide his nation to the right path. Allah Almighty didn't let his passion go to waste and instructed him to reform the nation as His prophet.

Betterment and reformation of Madiyan was a huge task. Reformation and guiding of a nation, who was deep in swamp of their sins, was a very difficult assignment. However, Hazrat Shoaib (as) started this task in Allah's name and went to every town and village of the region. His only call was that O people, refrain from mischief. Have fear of Allah and listen to me. Stop doing fraud in transactions and robbery. Allah Almighty has granted you with so many bounties, you will still be rich even if you let go of the bad deeds.

People of Madiyan laughed on Hazrat Shoaib^{AS} and made condescending remarks. They commented that Shoaib (as) is telling us the strange secrets of trade and asking us to don't be dishonest and deceive our customers. They said that, "it was all part of their business, it is a very efficient and intelligent way of conducting trade, we invented new ways of trade, how would he (Hazrat Shoaib^{AS}) know what real trade is? All he can see is evil in us and cannot notice our accomplishments". Some said that Hazrat Shoaib^{AS} is a traitor and some other nation has assigned him the duty of stopping us from our ways. Majority of the nations denied his prophethood and his claim of reformation. They called him liar and continuously mock him on his guidance.

The matter of dishonesty and falsity was an ongoing routine of these people and eventually the punishment was decided for this nation. Hazrat Shoaib^{AS} warned his nation about the day, but they increased in their rejection of Hazrat Shoaib (as). They stated: enough talk, you are an ordinary person. If you are not, then go and bring this divine punishment upon us, and only then we will believe you".

Matter had gone too far. People of Madiyan had crossed the limits in rejection and therefore the door to belief was closed upon them. They selected the punishment day as their criteria of truth, which is why it was a necessary for them to see the sign of truth, the righteousness of Hazrat Shoaib^{AS}. And so, it happened...

One day, thick clouds started to form above Madiya. People were busy in their daily business and life, taking the clouds as forecast of pleasant weather, not knowing that the will of GOD is going to manifest through these clouds.

Houses, buildings and shops, all were getting demolished, people were dying, noise and cries were all over the city and there was no way out of this punishment which fell on this nation. Every demolished house was a grave to its residents. Rain and storm was not letting anything left standing. A very painful scene emerged with the stopping of the rain, all the beautiful houses and markets which were built on top of their dishonest income was nothing but ruins. The scene was same everywhere...without any exception! This was the fate which was chosen by people of Madiyan by themselves!!

It was quite everywhere; thick jungles are still there but no Sheppard was taking his animals to the trees. Caravans between Yemen and Syria were still using the same route but didn't see the people of Madiyan anymore. A large nation, residents of Madin, had become the story of the past. Today, there were only ruins and some mountains which were the graves of Madiyans. The strange graves of deceitful and dishonest nation!

Hazrat Ya'qub (as)

Hazrat Ya'qub (as) name is mentioned 16 times in the Holy Qur'an, and is known as patriarch of Islam. He preached the same monotheistic (belief in one God) faith as his forefathers Hazrat Ibrahim (as), Hazrat Ishaq (as) and Hazrat Ismail (as). He was the son of Hazrat Ishaq (as), and he preached the oneness of God throughout his life. Muslims, Christians and Jews agree that Hazrat Ya'qub (as) had twelve sons, each of which would go on to father the "Twelve Tribes of Israel".

Hazrat Ya'qub (as) wanted to make sure before his death that his children would remain true to their faith of worshipping the one true God. Therefore, he took one last promise from them. When he asked them who they would worship after his death, they replied "We shall worship thy God and the God of thy fathers – of Ibrahim, Ismail, and Ishaq" (Holy Qur'an, 2:134)

Hazrat Ya'qub (as)'s main importance lay in his great submission to God and his firm faith in the right religion. As a patriarch, he alongside Hazrat Ibrahim (as) may be the most fruitful according to tradition. From his twelve sons were to come many other great prophets; including Hazrat Yunus (as), Hazrat Daud (as), Hazrat Sulaiman (as) and Hazrat Isa (as).

The sanctuary of Hazrat Ibrahim (as) is located in the ancient city of Hebron. It is said to be the burial place for three prophets and their wives; Hazrat Ibrahim (as), Hazrat Ishaq (as), and Hazrat Ya'qub (as).
