1. The **Holy Qur'an and Hadith** section marks have been modified such that a student can still achieve passing marks if they have either only studied the material or have only done the Assignment questions. However, both studying and doing the assignment questions will grant maximum marks and will be the best practice.
2. The **Book Study** section does not have Assignment questions so readings must be done for marks.

3. The **Semester Assignments** will constitute 40% of the Final Mark and the Exam 60% of the Final Mark

Note 1: It is recommended that students do the assignment questions since these questions will be on the exam and filling them out online does not require too much time.

Note 2: Month 5&6 have double marks because of the combined syllabus

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE STUDENT

- Huzoor (atba) has stated that if Waqf Nau girls fully learn their syllabus their knowledge can be as good as Jamia students (and even more, if they are eager to learn) (Gulshan-e-WaqfeNau Class UK 7th Dec, 2013)
- Last date to submit monthly assignment using the appropriate Google form is last date of every month.
- All Assignments should be completed before the Exam; as Assignment constitute 40% of the final marks (exams will be held in January & July)
- Students should keep up with the monthly readings so that they are not overwhelmed at the end of the semester
- Students are highly recommended to do the assignments as the exam will be based on these questions.
- Students should try not skip any material and properly learn because this material is important and will help their religious knowledge which is crucial as Waqf Nau.
- **Fast Track**– If a student desires to complete semesters early and give the exam they will need to inform their In-charge. The student can then be added to the Fast Track list and they will need to inform their In-charge once they have submitted all their assignments and are ready for an exam.
